Man Accused Of Raping Girl, 11, In Parking Lot

Suspect Allegedly Used Chat Room To Arrange Meeting

LOUISVILLE -- A Kentucky man was charged over the weekend with raping a young girl he allegedly met in an Internet chat room.

Moussa Dieye, 24, of Murray, Ky., allegedly lured the 11-year-old girl to a K-Mart parking lot and raped her, NewsChannel 32 reported.

Police said Dieye commuted with the girl via the Internet for months before the rape.

The arrest turned the spotlight on a local police officer who is spearheading a nationwide organization aimed at fighting Internet crime.

David Evangelista, a part-time officer in Vine Grove and the creator of the U.S. Internet Crime Task Force Inc., said that the Web is a playground for criminals, including many who prey on children.

"We are constantly monitoring the Internet chat rooms and Web site content," Evangelista said. "Anything from cyber stalking to harassment to credit card fraud and things of that nature."

Evangelista said his task force has closed down 15,000 chat rooms in the past year after evidence was found that people were using the rooms to look for children.

Evangelista said that parents must play a role, too.

"I think the most important aspect of having children on the Internet at home is to make sure you monitor your children's activity," he said. "Keep the computer in an open area in the home that you can walk by and watch what they're doing."
